

Rucking is simply walking while wearing a weighted backpack, or *ruck*. The word ruck derives from the German word *rucksack*, meaning backpack. VETERANS INFORMATION

VFW National Commander Testifies Before Congress: VFW National Commander Al Lipphardt testified before a joint hearing of the Senate and House Committees on Veterans' Affairs. The VFW delivered its top legislative priorities of unaddressed toxic exposures, transition from service, alternative PTSD treatments, predatory claims companies, and GI Bill parity. Lipphardt explained that while the benefits afforded to our all-volunteer force may seem generous to those who never served, these benefits are simply the warranty of the service contract each veteran signs before putting on the uniform. "By contract, you must ensure the VA has the resources and staff to provide veterans their full earned benefits," Lipphardt said. "This is not an ask. Honor the contract!"

VFW Testifies on Claim Sharks Legislation: VFW National Legislative Director Pat Murray testified at a House Veterans' Affairs Subcommittee on Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs hearing on the disagreement about fees for services rendered in the preparation of initial and supplemental claims for veterans' benefits. "The VFW continues to lead the charge against unaccredited, unscrupulous actors we call Claim Sharks who charge service members, veterans, and survivors illegal fees," Murray stated. "Our resolutions urge Congress to pass legislation that protect VA beneficiaries from predatory companies and individuals attempting to bypass the VA accreditation system and monetize the disability or death benefits of veterans and

VFW National Commander Meets with VA Secretary: VFW National Commander Al Lipphardt and VFW Washington Office Executive Director Ryan Gallucci met with VA Secretary Doug Collins to share the VFW's concerns and priorities. Central to the discussion was understanding the Secretary's plan for reducing the VA workforce amid concerning reports from VFW members that key services were affected by recent layoffs. The discussion was constructive, and the VFW sees opportunities to work with Secretary Collins on issues like consistent care delivery by VA and community providers, as well as modernizing benefits delivery. Lipphardt emphasized that the VFW would hold him to his commitment not to reduce care or benefits for veterans with the new directives.

Representative Receives VFW Congressional Award: The VFW presented its 2025 Congressional Award to Rep. Derrick Van Orden (WI-3) for his outstanding service and years of unwavering support of veterans, service members, their families, and survivors. "In Representative Van Orden, we have found a devoted, passionate and determined advocate for our military and veteran communities," said VFW National Commander Al Lipphardt. "His resolve for accountability and action on some of our most pressing issues is clear, and we could not be more thrilled to have him in our corner not only as a member of Congress but also as a VFW Life member." Accepting his award, Van Orden said, "No one is going to take care of us but us. Notice, I didn't say Republican or Democrat. Sixty-nine percent of my legislation is bipartisan, because if it makes sense I do it, and if it doesn't I don't. And we need

BATTLE OF THE MONTH



Battles of Lexington and Concord

The **Battles of Lexington and Concord** were the first major military campaign of the <u>American Revolutionary War</u>, resulting in an American victory and outpouring of militia support for the anti-British cause. The battles were fought on April 19, 1775, in <u>Middlesex County</u> in the <u>colonial-era Province of Massachusetts Bay</u>, within the towns of <u>Lexington</u>, <u>Concord</u>, <u>Lincoln</u>, <u>Menotomy</u> (present-day Arlington), and <u>Cambridge</u>. They marked the outbreak of armed conflict between the <u>Kingdom of Great Britain</u> and <u>Patriot militias</u> from America's Thirteen Colonies.

In late 1774, Colonial leaders adopted the <u>Suffolk Resolves</u> in resistance to the <u>alterations made to the Massachusetts colonial government</u> by the British parliament following the <u>Boston Tea Party</u>. The colonial assembly responded by forming a Patriot provisional government known as the <u>Massachusetts Provincial Congress</u> and calling for local militias to train for possible hostilities. The Colonial government effectively controlled the colony outside of British-controlled <u>Boston</u>. In response, the British government in February 1775 declared Massachusetts to be in a state of rebellion.

About 700 <u>British Army regulars</u> in <u>Boston</u>, under <u>Lieutenant Colonel Francis Smith</u>, were given secret orders to capture and destroy Colonial military supplies reportedly stored by the Massachusetts <u>militia</u> at Concord. Through effective <u>intelligence</u> gathering, <u>Patriot</u> leaders had received word weeks before the expedition that their supplies might be at risk and had moved most of them to other locations. On the night before the battle, warning of the British expedition had been <u>rapidly sent</u> from Boston to militias in the area by several riders, including <u>Paul Revere</u> and <u>Samuel Prescott</u>, with information about British plans. The initial mode of the Army's arrival by water was signaled from the <u>Old North Church</u> in Boston to <u>Charlestown</u> using lanterns to communicate "one if by land, two if by sea".

The first shots were fired just as the sun was rising at Lexington. Eight militiamen were killed, including Ensign Robert Munroe, their third in command. The British suffered only one casualty. The militia was outnumbered and fell back, and the regulars proceeded on to Concord, where they broke apart into companies to search for the supplies. At the North Bridge in Concord, approximately 400 militiamen engaged 100 regulars from three companies of the King's troops at about 11:00 am, resulting in casualties on both sides. The outnumbered regulars fell back from the bridge and rejoined the main body of British forces in Concord.

The British forces began their return march to Boston after completing their search for military supplies, and more militiamen continued to arrive from the neighboring towns. Gunfire erupted again between the two sides and continued throughout the day as the regulars marched back towards Boston. Upon returning to Lexington, Lt. Col. Smith's expedition was rescued by reinforcements under <u>Brigadier General Earl Percy</u>. The combined force of about 1,700 men marched back to Boston under heavy fire in a <u>tactical withdrawal</u> and eventually reached the safety of Charlestown. The accumulated militias then blockaded the narrow land accesses to Charlestown and Boston, starting the siege of Boston.






